Manchester City Council has been an anchor partner of Bikeability since the inception of the scheme 15 years ago. Many Manchester schools hosted Bikeability pilots via BikeRight! during the development period between 2005 and 2007 and again during the innovation of Level 3 and Bikeability Plus. Even before Bikeability was launched the city was supporting its own 'Safer Cycling' scheme as early as 2003 – setting the standard and demonstrating leadership after the demise of cycling proficiency.

BikeRight! have been a key strategic partner to Manchester City Council for nearly two decades. This partnership remains strong today and is equally relevant as Manchester aims to transform itself in to an active and sustainable city through development of the Bee Network led by mayor Andy Burnham and the city's cycling and walking commissioner Sir Chris Boardman.

Bikeability is offered to all primary schools in the city, with around 3500 children benefiting from Level 1 and 2 training, nearly 1000 from Level 3 and over 600 Bikeability Plus sessions (2019/20 delivery).

Manchester City Council is also supportive of many other initiatives that reinforce the aims of Bikeability and the National Cycle Training Standards such as:

- Road Safety Week events at schools
- Bike Week
- Bike to school week

BikeRight! and Manchester City Council will continue to work in close partnership as Bikeability widens it's reach through extended funding and the new 1st4sport level 2 and 3 qualifications.

BikeRight! has developed an excellent relationship with both the City Council and the area's schools.

From a social and added value perspective, the ongoing support from Manchester City Council has facilitated:

- The employment of over 50 local people, supporting numerous families
- Upskilling a workforce to deliver initiatives such as instructor training, City & Guilds cycle mechanic training and Safe Urban Driving

- Resulted in spin off opportunities for cycling development outside of Bikeability such as adult cycle training, bicycle maintenance courses, safe urban driving and work with the emergency services
- Support for many local community initiatives, charities and hard to reach groups such as refugees, LGBT, BAME, homeless, NEETS and looked after children

In essence Bikeability has been the epicentre of a huge array of initiatives that have had wide reaching benefits to communities and individuals across Manchester. Benefits that will continue to be realised for decades to come. Just one example of this is that some early Manchester Bikeability trainees have subsequently been employed by BikeRight! as instructors.


